

Activities include hiking trails, a bird viewing station, a fishing lake, wildflower fields, sports fields, and playgrounds. Look for frogs at Cool Springs Park. Go fishing or see the ducks at Lake Kyle Park. See butterflies in the wildflower fields at Lake Kyle and Bunton Creek Parks. Watch for migrating birds at the Bunton Creek Park bird viewing station.

- In the winter the birds find plenty of food in the south.
- In the spring the birds return north to a new food supply.
- This bird <u>migration</u> route is called the Central Flyway. The flyway goes right over Hays County.
- Migrating birds need a <u>waystation</u>, a safe place to rest while on their journey.
- Kyle Parks and Plum Creek are popular places for birds to rest. There are ponds and creeks for water, seeds and insects for food, and trees for shelter.
- Watch for these <u>migrating</u> birds robins, hummingbirds, and geese.







An **aquatic system** is the <u>ecosystem</u> around a body of water such as Plum Creek or the ponds at Cool Springs Park. All living things within the **aquatic system** rely on one another to keep a healthy environment.
