Chimney Swifts (Chaetura pelagica)

 A Chimney Swift is a small bird with long, narrow curved wings and a short tail. Some people think the Chimney Swift looks like a flying bow and arrow.



- These sleek flyers eat, sleep, and do just about everything while in the air, except raise their young.
- Chimney Swifts like to build their nests in human-made stone chimneys. That is why they are called Chimney Swifts!
- Nowadays, modern chimneys block the entry. Swifts cannot make their nests inside, so towers are built to help them.
- Volunteers at Patsy Glenn Refuge built a special tower that is a perfect place for a Chimney Swift nest. Can you find the tower?
